Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month Photo Contest





FUNDING ASSISTANCE:

The New Jersey Department of Children and Families, which serves children and youth up to age 21, is currently accepting requests from families for financial assistance toward the 2018 summer camp

season. Completed applications for both Financial Support toward Summer Camp Tuition and One-to-One Aide Services for Summer Camp must be postmarked or received by PerformCare no later than Monday, April 30, 2018. GRANT UPDATES:

The Arc of Essex County is busy preparing for the 2018 camp season and engaging the community to enhance the summer camp experience. In addition to the facility improvements introduced last summer, Catholic Human Services Foundation contributed an additional \$8,575 grant to enhance the splash pad with a spraying orb feature. Additionally, the United Way of Northern New Jersey and the Orange Orphan Society have contributed \$5,000 and \$7,500 respectively to provide financial assistance to families in need.

The Arc of Essex County thanks everyone who has contributed so generously to Camp Hope and looks forward to welcoming campers to the 2018 season on July 2.

Exciting Group Home and Day Program Renovations in the Works

The Arc of Essex County' property management team has been working diligently on four new capital improvement projects.



The Washington group home is receiving an interior and exterior facelift. The renovations will provide greater accessibility in the home, such as in the bathroom and bedrooms, ramping for an accessible egress, and a new addition off of the back of the home creating more space. The Cedar Grove home is expecting similar renovations as well as a new fire sprinkler system. Finally, the Millburn group home will undergo interior revitalization for greater accessibility and a new fire sprinkler system. The anticipated completion dates for all three group home projects is mid-June.

Renovations at The Arc's West Caldwell Hub will focus mainly on the interior. The Arc of Essex County's property management team will reconfigure the entry way area and open up existing program space to make larger rooms. They also plan to install an alternate, primary entry door on the right side of the building into the program. The project will kick off later this spring.

- Let reservation agents, gate agents, and flight attendants know that you or someone you are traveling with has special needs.
- Book early to get seats you want. Seats in the front of the aircraft are quieter and you can exit sooner.
- When booking, consider putting a child with special needs in the center seat if traveling with two adults or the window seat. Or, have one adult sit in front of the child in case the child kicks the seat.
- 4. Check in with the gate agent when you arrive.
- 5. Board last to lessen the time spent on the plane.
- 6. If you're traveling with another adult, have the other adult board first to set up a "nesting are" (iPad, blanket, snacks, etc.).
- 7. Bring something new and exciting to give to your child once they get on the plane.
- 8. For possible pressurization issues, have the child keep talking to you, swallow water, chew gum, or use a rubber oral sensory chewing tool while taking off and landing.
- 9. During takeoff and landing, the engines will be loud. For sensitivity to loud noises, use noise-canceling headphones or soft earplugs.
- 10. Call the TSA Cares help line (1-855-787-2227) 72 hours before traveling to ask for a passenger support specialist who can provide on-the-spot assistance during the security screening process.
