While there, they also checked out the "I Explore" area where they played with light pegs, an air maze, and rice tables. The day was complete with a brown bag lunch in the cafeteria.

Then, on Monday, May 7th the school participated in the annual Elks Festival at the Turtle Back Zoo. The students had fun looking at the animals, going in the bird aviary, and riding the train and carousel. They enjoyed hot dogs and ice cream for lunch after receiving bracelets from a local Girl Scout troop and winning prizes by playing various games.


