



# Home Assistance Program

### **Now Accepting New Families**

The Arc of Essex County is currently accepting additional families into its Home Assistance Program (HAP). HAP provides services to low income families whose child has an intellectual or



developmental disability in the areas of transportation, community resources, housing, navigating school systems, recreation, and, at times, skill trainings. The goal of the program is to maintain the family unit, attain independence, and assist parents and families in becoming more self-sufficient both economically and personally.

Families interested in joining the program must meet the following requirements:

- Live within Essex County and be considered low income
- Child must be registered with the Division of Children and Families (a CYBER number provided by DCF is required)
- Families must be available during the day-time hours for assistance with accessing the following:
  - o Food banks
  - Medicaid
  - Doctor appointment
  - School appointments
  - o WIC
  - o Other social service/community agencies

# **Remembering Former Livingston Mayor**

### and Board Member Bob Leopold

G. Robert 'Bob' Leopold served on The Arc of Essex County's Board of Directors for nearly 30 years. During that time, he took on leadership positions as a trustee, advisory board member, as well as first and second Vice President. The former Mayor of Livingston, Bob was also instrumental in The Arc's expansion of day programs and group homes within the town.

A former Bell Labs employee and Navy veteran, Bob was committed to social justice. He was active with organizations such as the American Jewish Congress, the local Environmental Commission, and the Democratic Party, in addition to his service to The Arc. He served as Mayor of Livingston in the 1980's and was active on the Livingston planning and zoning boards.
