



COVID-19 Update from the CEO



Dear Members of The Arc Family:

We are living in unprecedented times and collectively questioning what is next amidst the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak. As we've detailed over the past three weeks, The Arc of Essex County is continuing to monitor and respond to the almost daily changing Coronavirus situation. We continue to rely on guidance from federal and state authorities while aggressively adhering to CDC health and hygiene protocols.

As you know, the first Friday of each month marks the release of The Guardian, The Arc of Essex County's monthly e-newsletter. In this special COVID-19 edition, we highlight how life goes on at The Arc of Essex County while practicing social distancing and look forward to warmer weather and healthier times.

The status of our programs remains the same. However, we continue to implement new measures in an effort to ensure the health and wellbeing of our residents and staff:

New Measures:

- Deployment of iPhones to consumers and programs for remote monitoring (Facetime)
- Increased use of telemedicine services with Station MD, the DDC and other medical providers

Current Closures:

- Shapiro Center for Early Intervention: Suspended; modified teleservices began 4/1
- Stepping Stones School: Suspended; remote learning plan activated
- Stepping Stones Early Intervention: Suspended until further notice
- Children and Adult Individual and Group Respite and Recreation Programs: Suspended for consumers until DDD/DCF authorize return
- Adult Day Programs: Suspended for consumers until DDD authorizes return

Ongoing Services:

- Residential Services: No outside visitors; only essential community activities
- Administrative Support: The main office is open with limited hours, staggered, and remote staffing; only essential visitors
- Program Administration: Staff deployed to Arc locations to support residential services
- Everyone entering the residential programs (including staff) are required to have their temperatures taken prior to entering the home.
- Support staff shopping teams continue to pick up and deliver items including groceries to group homes as needed.

Our staff, especially those in direct support positions, are the heartbeat of our organization. We continue to commend them for their unwavering dedication to those we serve. I encourage you to continue to reach out to thank them and share your appreciation with us.

Beginning on Friday, March 13, The Arc of Essex County's residential programs began practicing social distancing as a way to remain healthy amidst the COVID-19 outbreak. While this meant the cancellation of Adult Recreation & Respite and Day Programming outside of the home, The Arc remains committed to maintaining a regular daily schedule full of engaging activities.

Residential and Day Program staff teamed up to execute this new approach. For the Millburn Group Home, this meant developing a weekly calendar of activities that incorporates every residents' interests. Activities include in-home spa days, karaoke and music classes, arts & crafts, and staying active through chair yoga, dancing, and neighborhood walks.

The Nutley Group Home and many others adopted a similar approach. Nutley residents enjoyed making personal-pan pizzas, baking and decorating



cupcakes, taking in the blooming cherry blossoms, and completing puzzles to name a few.

The Arc of Essex County would like to recognize and thank our direct support professionals (DSPs) who are reporting to work every day to support the consumers living in our residential services. These frontline staff are caring for our residents as they would their own family. It is only with the extraordinary hard work and dedication of the staff, especially the DSP's, that The Arc of Essex County can continue to provide the necessary direct care and support to our residential consumers in an unprecedented environment.

Camp Hope Receives More Than \$13,000

in Grants

The Orange Orphan Society and Investors Bank recently awarded The Arc of Essex County grants totaling more than \$13,000 to support the agency's Camp Hope program. The Arc will utilize a \$1,000 grant from Investors Bank and a \$7,500 grant from Orange Orphan Society to fund camperships for children and adults in need. The Orange Orphan



Society's grant will be directed specifically to campers up to 18 years of age in need of fee assistance living in the Oranges or Maplewood.

An additional \$4,639 from the Orange Orphan Society will be used to purchase outdoor furniture for the recently renovated pool pavilion and golf equipment including a mobile driving range. The Arc of Essex County would like to thank Orange Orphan Society and Investors Bank for their continued support of the Camp Hope program.



Camp Hope is a seven week summer day camp for children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities located in East Hanover. Operating since 1956, camp runs Monday through Friday, 9 am to 3 pm, starting in late June and ending in August, with transportation provided for campers living in Essex County and surrounding areas. Camp Hope provides campers with traditional camp activities including supervised swimming and outdoor fun with modified sports, arts & crafts, and music. While enjoying these activities, attention is also given to daily living skills, peer interaction, socialization skills, and developing appropriate behaviors.
